Course Description

General Guild Line for the Collective Score Tasks

1. Online Health Poster

- a. Make a group of 5
- b. Each member roughly present on his/her interested <u>disease</u> (such as flu, diarrhea, Alzheimer's disease, etc.) or <u>health-related issue</u> (such as insomnia, obesity, Losing weight, virgin cold pressed coconut oil, etc.)
- c. Each group select the most interested topic and discuss with your section's lecturer.
- d. Use any program to create a health poster (Size: 1,200 x 630 pixels)
- e. Please remember to include the following details on your poster.
 - i. What is your group's selected disease/health issue?
 - ii. Why is it important? Is it harmful?
 - iii. Cause, symptoms, prevention, and treatment of your disease/health issue.
 - iv. Other information that you considered important.
 - v. Your group's health-related issue message (for example, health message for insomnia is "Stop thinking and go to sleep.")
