GUIDELINES

WU-TEP assesses students' levels of English proficiency in listening, reading, writing, and speaking, framed by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and Classical Test Theory (CTT).

Test Format	Total Number of Questions	Duration
1. Listening consists of four parts:		
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 1: You will hear four statements about a picture, and then, you will select one statement that best describes what you see about the picture.	5	40 minutes
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 2: You will hear a question or statement and three responses spoken in English. Then, you will choose the best response to the question or statement.	15	
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 3: You will hear some conversations between two people, and then, you will be asked to answer three questions about what the speakers say in each conversation.	15	
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 4: You will hear some talks given by a single speaker, and then, you will be asked to answer three questions about what the speaker says in each talk.	15	

2. Reading consists of three parts:									
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 5: You will complete sentences that miss a word or phrase.	20	60 minutes							
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 6: You will complete an e-mail that misses a word or phrase.	5								
<input type="checkbox"/> Part 7: You will read a selection of texts and choose the best answer for each question that follows each text.	25								
3. Writing									
<input type="checkbox"/> You will choose one topic to respond to and write a short passage of at least 150 words to elaborate your response		40 minutes							
4. Speaking									
<input type="checkbox"/> You will have a discussion with a lecturer. It will be interactive and as close to a real-life situation as a test can get.		5 minutes
