GUIDELINES

WU-TEP assesses students' levels of English proficiency in listening, reading, writing, and speaking, framed by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and Classical Test Theory (CTT).

1. Listening consists of four parts:		
Part 1: You will hear four statements about a picture, and then,	5	
you will select one statement that best describes what you see		
about the picture.		
Part 2: You will hear a question or statement and three	15	
responses spoken in English. Then, you will choose the best		
response to the question or statement.		
Part 3: You will hear some conversations between two people,	15	40 minutes
and then, you will be asked to answer three questions about		
what the speakers say in each conversation.		
Part 4: You will hear some talks given by a single speaker, and	15	
then, you will be asked to answer three questions about what		
the speaker says in each talk.		

2. Reading consists of thr	ee parts:			
Part 5: You will complete sentences that miss a word or			20	60 minutes
phrase.				
Part 6: You will complete an e-mail that misses a word or			5	
phrase.				
Part 7: You will read a selection of texts and choose the best			25	
answer for each question that follows each text.				
3. Writing				
You will choose one topic to respond to and write a short				40 minutes
passage of at least 150 words to elaborate your response				
4. Speaking	4. Speaking			
You will have a discussion with a lecturer. It will be interactive			5 minutes	
and as close to a real-life situation as a test can get.
