Course Description

This course is designed to strengthen learners' basic structural knowledge of English, to train them on the integration of the structural knowledge with basic communication skills, including reading, listening, writing and speaking, and to encourage those to further develop basic communication skills through everyday practices.

Course Objectives

Throughout the course participation, students must achieve 2 major learning outcomes: gain of basic structural knowledge and basic communication skills. Below are the details of the target learning outcome.

- 1. Structural knowledge: Students, demonstrating their basic structural knowledge, are able to
 - 1.1. Identify parts of speech of non-contextualized and contextualized words;
 - 1.2. Use words of the right parts of speech in meaningful contexts;
 - 1.3. Identify the subject and the predicate of sentences of all types;
 - 1.4. Distinguish between the finite and the non-finite verbs in sentences;
 - 1.5. Identify sentence types: simple, compound, complex and multi-structured; and
 - 1.6. Identify sentence functions: statements, questions, instructions and exclamations.
- 2. Basic communication skills
 - 2.1. Students are able to apply their language knowledge to watch an English movie of interest:
 - 2.2. Students are able to apply their language knowledge with the productive skills of writing through the creation of a group in social media in English. They are required to:
 - 2.2.1. Write at least 10 correct and meaningful sentences to introduce themselves, excluding the sentence introducing their name, on social media,

- 2.2.2. Share and recommend at least 6 fun and useful sources for English learning and practices (including vocabulary development, grammar reviews, listening, speaking, reading and writing), and
- 2.2.3. Share and recommend or criticize experiences with a movie
- 2.3. Students are able to apply their language knowledge with the productive skills of speaking through the participation of a small group discussion on their English skills development through the use of social media.

Evaluation of Achievement

1. Three (3) major Tasks (10 points each)

- 1.1) Introduction of each group members (at least 10 sentences in paragraph form), excluding the sentence that display the group member's name.
- 1.2) Group recommendation and evaluation of a digital or online source for the English learning in the following areas: vocabulary, grammar, listening, speaking, reading and writing
- 1.3) The group's share and recommendation or critique of a contemporary movie.

2. Class Participation/Quizzes/Homework/Attendance

20%

- Students who attend the course <u>less than 80% (10 periods) will automatically get an F</u>. They have to sign their names within the first 30 minutes of each period or else they will be marked "absent".
- In case of <u>illness or accident</u>, the students have to contact the section's lecturer to ask for an extra homework/task. Medical certificates or other evidence are also required.
- In case of <u>personal leave</u>, the students have to let the section's lecturer know <u>in advance</u> and ask for the extra homework/task.
- The students are required to complete the weekly task/quizzes set by the lecturer.
- They have to submit the writing homework on the first meeting of the following week.

3. Self-Study on WU E-Learning

- The students are required to access the university's E-Learning to practice English.
- Only a <u>laptop or PC</u> is recommended to be used to access the E-Learning. The coordinators and lecturers will <u>not be responsible</u> for any problems due to individual technical issues.

5. 3-hour Final Examination (Multiple choices and Writing)

(Listening, Grammar, Reading Comprehension, and Writing – vocabulary will be blended in every part of the exam)

Tentative Grading Policies

- 1. The grading will be based on the normalize <u>T-Score</u> as provided in the university's CES system or other policy as the General Education Board agrees.
- 2. If a student <u>misses any of the score components</u> (the 4 Tasks, Homework, Class participation, English Assessment, E-Learning, and the Final examination), he or she will <u>automatically get an F</u>.
- 3. 

General Guidelines for Course Tasks

Task 1: Self Introduction (Individual)

Instructions:

Form a group of 5 (FIVE) members and do the following;

- 1. Create a group in Facebook and indicate the group number. i.e. ENG109-2017 Group 1
- 2. Each member will introduce himself/herself with the following standards, in a paragraph format.
 - a. Describe yourself your looks, features, character
 - b. What do your friends say about you?
 - c. What is you plan in the future?
 - d. What are the things you enjoy here at Walailak University?
- 3. You cannot edit your work once you have posted it in Facebook.
- 4. Point deduction for the late submission is as follows:
 - a. One day minus 2 points from the actual score
 - b. Two days minus 3 points from the actual score
 - c. Three days minus 5 points from the actual score
 - d. More than four days late will get zero.

Task 2: Evaluation and Recommendation of an Online digital Source (Group)

Instructions:

- 1. With the same group in task 1, select any online digital source which can help you develop your English language learning.
- 2. Run the program and analyze how it can help you in the area of vocabulary development, grammar, listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- 3. Take a 3-5 minutes video of your group discussing about the program. Your conversation will be in English.
- 4. Post the summary of your discussion in your group page.

Task 3: Movie Review (Group)

Instructions:

- 1. The lecturer will assign a movie for you to watch.
- 2. Answer the questions to be given by your lecturer about the movie.
- 3. Complete the transcript of the portion of the movie as designated.
- 4. Give your over-all commendation and recommendation of the movie.
- 5. Record the minutes of the activity indicating the date, time, place and members present. Write a short summary of the activity.
- 6. Submit you answer in a pdf file and post it in your group page.

In case of illness, accidents, and other significant errands

- 1. In case of <u>accidents or severe illness</u> on each task presentation day, the student must inform the lecturer <u>by that day</u> (by his/herself or his/her friend) and turn in the medical certificate as soon as possible.
- 2. In case of other significant errands, the student must inform the lecturer in advance (by his/herself or his/her friend) and show to the lecturer the pictures of his/her mission as soon as possible.
- 3. The student who did not present in any task must contact the lecturer for his/her own make-up presentation as soon as possible if he/she has evidence and valid reasons.
- 4. The student who did not present would get 0 if he/she has no evidence and valid reason (no make-up presentation).
